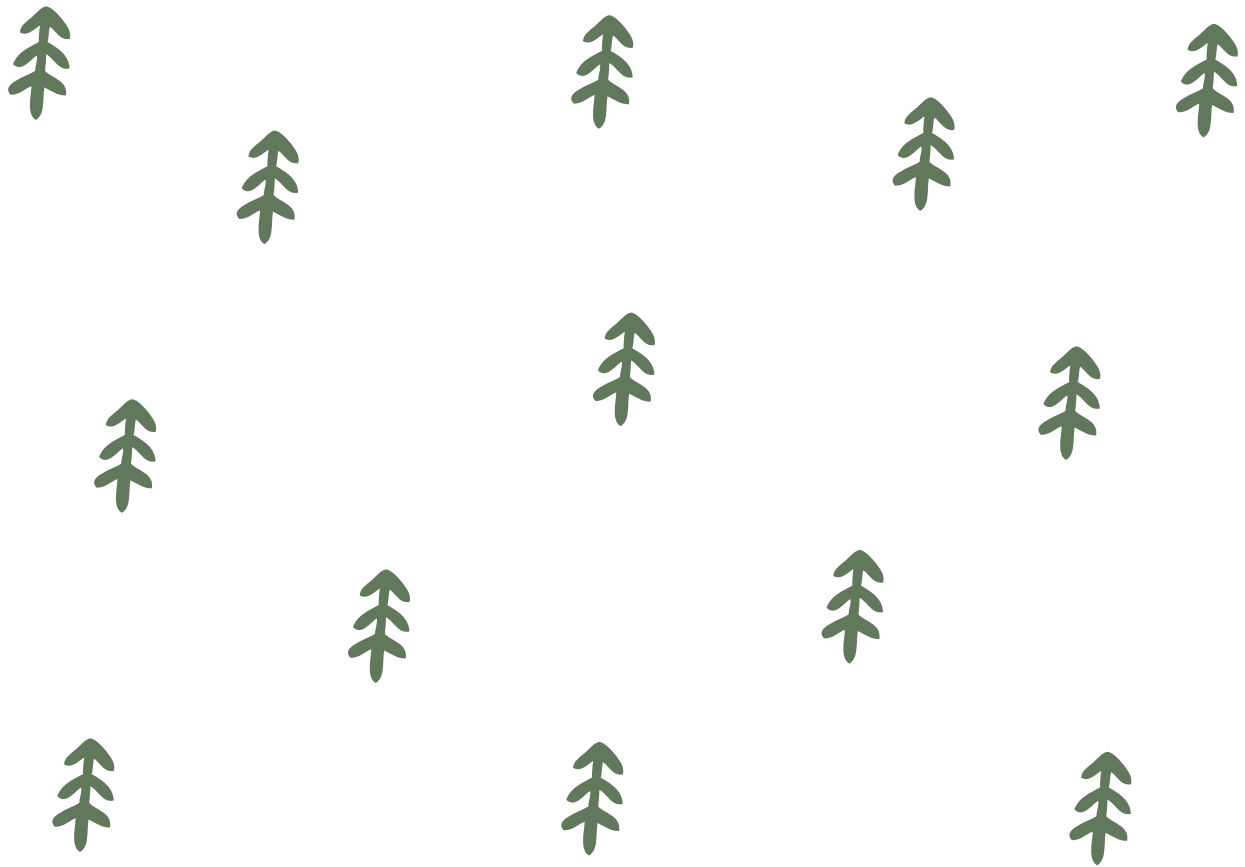


How to Embroider a

TRANSFER PEN METHOD

(best for light colored fabrics / smooth weave fabrics)

SUPPLIES

sulky iron on transfer pen

vellum

lightweight yarn

(we used Quince & Co. Tern yarn in the sea grass colorway)

INSTRUCTIONS

Print out pine tree template.



Trace pattern (using sulky + transfer pen) onto vellum. Place the vellum (with the transfer pen marked side facing down) and iron directly onto the surface you wish to embroider. Peel off vellum and embroider following the illustrated steps.

Tie off yarn in the back.

FREEZER PAPER METHOD

(best for dark fabrics/textured fabrics)

SUPPLIES

freezer paper
pen or pencil

INSTRUCTIONS

Print out pine tree template.



Trace pattern onto matte side of freezer paper. Iron the freezer paper tracing (shiny side down) onto the surface you wish to embroider. Following the illustrated steps, stitch through the freezer paper and fabric. Peel off freezer paper when finished.

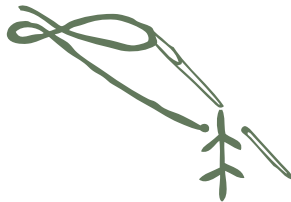
